Following her success in the British Maths
Olympiad last year, King Edward VII student
Emily Beatty (Year 12) was invited by the
United Kingdom Mathematics Trust to participate in a weeklong training camp over the summer holidays at Oxford University. There she underwent a rigorous schedule of up to nine hours of intense masterclasses per day.

To top off her stunning achievement, Emily, in her words, "absolutely smashed" the course's final exam, which lasted four and a half hours and consisted of three fiendishly difficult questions. She scored 20/21, placing her almost at the very top of the cohort, which considering that the "cohort" consisted of the top 21 mathematicians under the age of 16 nationwide, is an outstanding feat.

As a result, Emily has been placed on an advanced mentoring scheme. She is "a little bit taken aback" by all she has achieved, but reports that everything is going smoothly.

Sarah is a parent governor with a child in Year 13. A teacher of French and English


